## Danish Parliamentarian Ida Auken on Denmark's Recent Relationship with the United States

The Trump administration speaking through its Vice President ID Vance recently has shown an unexpected misreading of the Danish-American relationship, which until recently has been strong and cooperative. Following the signing of our Constitution on September 17, 1787, Denmark, which in the eighteenth century included Norway, Iceland, Greenland, the Faroe Islands, and the Danish Virgin Islands, was one of the first countries to publish and spread the ideals of the United States' Constitution. Also, Denmark is one of few countries that celebrates our Fourth of July with festivities at Rebild Park, Jutland, inviting well known American and Danish speakers while thousands of Danes cheer from the adjoining hills. ID Vance certainly must know that the United States and Denmark have enjoyed a long relationship since 1949 as partners in NATO along today with 30 other member-states; his recent statements in Greenland slamming Denmark for "not being a good ally" to the United States and not doing enough to ensure Greenland's protection seems far out of

bounds and certainly raised diplomatic eyebrows and anxieties. Fortunately, a Danish member of Parliament (Folketing) and member of its Social Democrats Party, Ida Auken, responded to Vance's recent comments in a recent New York Times editorial. A short selection of Ida Auken's important statements from her poignant editorial follows:

"The United States has been Denmark's closest ally for 80 years. We have followed American presidents into wars that many Danes felt were not ours to fight....Thousands of Danish troops went on to serve in Iraq and Afghanistan after Sept. 11. More than 50 of them died.... Denmark lost roughly as many service members per capita in Afghanistan as the United States did...We understand the importance of alliances and cherish our partnership with the United States....

President Trump has concerns about security in the Arctic, of course; our countries should work together to address them. ## Swedish American Actor Val Kilmer Passes Away

Swedish American actor Val Kilmer passed away from pneumonia on April 1st, 2025.

Kilmer was born on December 31st, 1959 in Los Angeles to a Swedish American mother, Gladys Leach (nee Ekstadt) from Gary, Indiana. Kilmer's maternal grandfather was John Ekstadt born in Martin, Minnesota to Swedish parents and his maternal grandmother was Hilma Swanson who was born in Sweden.

Kilmer was the youngest person ever to be accepted into Juilliard's Drama Division in 1981. He was part of Group 10 which included Linda Kozlowski who later gained fame for Crocodile Dundee.

A consummate method actor, Kilmer was known for portraying intense, cool characters such as LT Tom "Iceman" Kazansky in Top Gun, Doc Holliday in Tombstone, and Jim Morrison in The Doors.

He was especially adept at weapons dexterity (second only to the legendary Steve McQueen) as displayed in the bank robbery scene in Michal Mann's Heat and the gunfight at the O.K. Corral in Tombstone.



## ASF NORDIC BOOK CLUB ONLINE PUNISHED BY ANN-HELÉN LAESTADIUS Tuesday, May 6, 6 PM

Join us to discuss contemporary Nordic literature online! On May 6, we'll be discussing Punished, a searing new novel from author Ann-Helén Laestadius, the internationally bestselling author of the "extraordinary" (Fredrik Backman) novel Stolen. In the 1950s near the Arctic Circle, seven-year-olds Jon-Ante, Else-Maj, Nilsa, Marge, and Anne-Risten are taken from their families. As children of Sámi reindeer herders, the Swedish state has mandated they attend a "nomad school," where they are forbidden to speak their native language. With only sporadic visits home, the parents know little about the abuse face, much of it at the



hands of their housemother Rita. Thirty years later, the now-grown adults have chosen different paths to cope with the past, some holding strong in their Sámi identity and others hiding their heritage. When their former housemother Rita appears, the five must face their past and decide: if you have the chance to punish someone who wronged you as a child, what will you do?
